



Marble Maze

Description

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Students create their own marble maze and get to play with the mazes of other students.

Supplies

- Paper plates (one for each student)
- Marbles (one for each student)
- Tape
- Construction paper
- Scissors
- Pipe cleaner or Wikki Sticks

How to Play

- 1. Give each student a paper plate, scissors, tape, construction paper, and pipe cleaners.
- 2. Students get creative and use tape and pipe cleaners to make a maze for marbles to go through. Students can create different pathways, pockets with point values, dead ends, ramps, etc. for their maze.
- 3. After students complete their maze, give them a marble so they can test it to ensure that the marble can fit in each of the pathways.
- 4. Have students trade with other students and practice going through their maze.
- 5. This can continue until time is up or until each student has traded with all the other students.

Activity Prompts for Reflection

What was a surprise that happened during this activity?



- How were you able to remain focused during this activity?
- · What was challenging about this activity?
- How did you feel when you tried out other students' mazes?

Other Ways to Play

- Have students vote and decide which maze was the most difficult to go through.
- Have different pieces of construction paper already cut out to make designing the maze easier.
- Allow students to work in pairs on this activity.
