

Musical Emotions

Description

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Students have fun dancing and moving around while also sharing when they feel certain emotions.

Supplies

- Music
- Printed emotion words (Found in Downloads and Links section)

How to Play

- 1. **Prep work:** Count the number of students and spread that number of emotion pages out, face down, around your space.
- 2. Explain to students that when the music starts, they dance around the room. When the music stops, students must find a sheet of paper and sit on it.
- 3. The leader calls out one emotion word and students look at their papers.
- 4. Whoever is sitting on that emotion, must stand up and say one time they felt that emotion.
- 5. Multiple rounds can be played, calling out different emotions each time, trying to ensure that each student gets a chance to share.

Activity Prompts for Reflection

- How did it feel to share your emotions?
- How did you feel when the emotion you were sitting on was called out?
- Would anyone like to share a time they also felt one of these emotions?
- Would anyone like to share an emotion they felt today?



- Print doubles of each emotion. Once the music stops students must find their match and share when they have felt that emotion recently.
- For younger students, take time to explain what more complex emotions mean before having them share.

Additional Notes

- Have students clap and cheer after each student shares.
- Use the SEL Activity Prompts to tie other SEL competencies to this activity.
