# **Description**

Students have fun deciding between two options and learning about other students.

# **Supplies**

• Two long ropes/jump ropes

## **How to Play**

- 1. Lay out two long ropes parallel to each other and have all students stand in between the "railroad tracks."
- 2. This activity has several rounds and for each round students are given two options.
- 3. As options are announced, point to which side represents each options, and students jump to the side of the railroad track that they would choose out of those 2 options.
- 4. After each round allow students to look around and see what everyone else decided.
- 5. Randomly throughout the activity yell "chugachugachoo" and call out a number. The student that is that number in line has to share why they chose what they chose.
- 6. Option ideas: Sweet or sour, summer or winter, outside or inside, cat or dog, day or night, fast food or home cooked meal, science or math, etc.

## **Activity Prompts for Reflection**



- Share something new you learned about someone else in the group?
- Can anyone explain why you chose one of the options during the activity?
- Does anyone have an idea for a different way to do this activity?
- What is one of the options that you felt strongly about?

## Other Ways to Play

- For a large space and large group, assign each side of the room for each option and students run to whatever side they would choose.
- Have trustworthy students help call out different options.
- After each round, have students who chose the same option get together and talk about why they chose that option.
